# 2022 Review

Round three was a 1-0 home win against Oakwood Glossop which put the Relics into the North West (East) Regional Final against GMWFL leaders Club Kingsmaid. In a close game the final result, a 3-1 win to Kingsmaid, was not a true reflection of a close game.

Having won the Plate in the same competition last year, the Relics were looking to try to better that performance if possible.
